

## Pastor's Corner

First, I want to take this opportunity to formally thank all of you for the generous love offering presented to me and Cathy at family night. That, plus other individual gifts & cards, have blessed us beyond what you all will ever know, especially after this challenging year of transition. While

God asked us to make some choices that caused much pain and loss, for those who call Him Lord, there is no other option than to trust and obey. And that is what we did. I cannot fully express how thankful I am for those who endured and said, "we are ready to follow the Lord and His Word, regardless of the cost." The fruit from the tough time of pruning has been a joy to watch, and our God has been glorified as we dug deep into His Word looking for direction and comfort. I heard statements like, "Boy, I realize how little I know about the Bible" and "I wish I had started learning sooner." These weren't statements from new believers, either; these were statements from some of our veterans in the faith.

This led me to think about something we need to start as a church in the new year. To be clear, this is not a New Year's Resolution (since most of those never make it past January). Instead, I am asking you to prayerfully consider joining me in continuing to be obedient to the commandments of God's word, and let's begin on January 1st.

As we look to 2015, I want us to take our spiritual walk to the next level. Jesus said in Matthew 28, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Folks, it is not enough to be saved. It's not even enough to live a good, godly life, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus' command & expectation is that every justified person will be teaching others everything that's been commanded to them. Wow. If that doesn't overwhelm you, it may be that you don't fully understand the magnitude of the responsibility.

TOBC Family, in 2015, I want to focus on growing as followers who are able to teach others everything He has taught and commanded us. For some, this is going to be a brand new thing. For others, this is going to be a continuation of what they are already doing. For everyone, it starts with ourselves, spreads to our families, then to the "nations." There is always another level of maturity to reach for.

Now, this can be an overwhelming endeavor to start alone, so I'm going to suggest a few things we can do, as a church body, to "spur one another on to good works,"

Hebrews 10:24.

- 1. Commit to read through the Bible in 2015. Folks, this is the basic building block of the spiritual life. There is no way you can teach what's been commanded if you don't know what's been commanded, or if you've only heard bits & pieces from others. I will be offering many suggested reading plans in the upcoming weeks. While I know you can start reading through the Bible anytime, many plans are set up to start on January 1st, so it makes it hard to start any other time. If the Lord is, in any way, prompting you to do this, please pray about what you (& perhaps your whole family) would want to use to start off your year through the Word.
- 2. <u>Memorize Bible verses and Learn Doctrinal questions, or catechisms</u>, to ensure you are always "prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have," 1 Peter3:15. I know many folks are uncomfortable with the word catechism, but I love how John Piper, a fellow Baptist pastor, explains it,

What is a catechism? In 1 Corinthians 14:19 Paul says, "In the church I would rather speak five words with my mind, in order to instruct others, than ten thousand words in a tongue." In Galatians 6:6 he says, "Let him who is taught the word share all good things with him who teaches." Acts 18:25 says that Apollos "has been instructed in the way of the Lord."

In each of these verses the Greek word for "instruct" or "teach" is katecheo. From this word we get our English word "catechize". It simply means to teach Biblical truth in an orderly way. Generally this is done with questions and answers accompanied by Biblical support and explanation.

Our children's department has been doing this for a while; it's time the rest of us caught up to them. At our January Family Night, I will share the catechism questions I will suggest we learn as a church, and for me, I truly hope they become part of consistent family worship time in my home.

So, even though it's only December, January 1st, 2015, will be here before we know it. And I'm asking every member to pray about being ready to start discipleship, not in a '12 wk, watch a video and answer questions' type of discipleship. While those can provide great resources, our focus needs to be bigger. I'm challenging us all to be ready to participate in a '52 wk, lead your family and live it in your home' type of discipleship that truly prepare us to fulfill His command.
